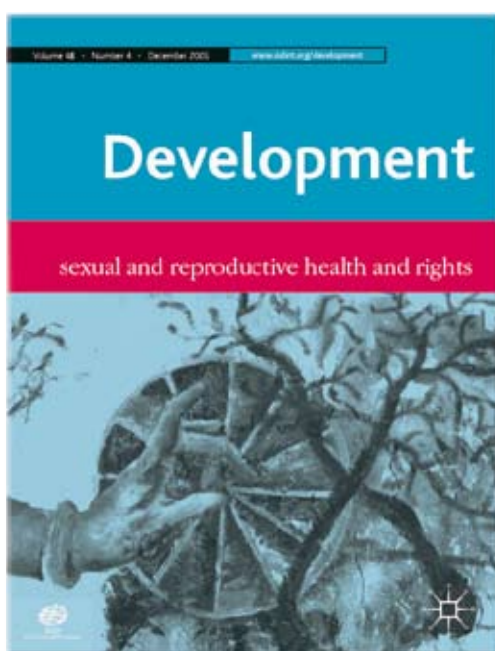

Pushed by the women's movements around the world, the International Conference on Population and Development's Programme of Action agreed to in Cairo September 1994 was something of a pinnacle in putting sexual and reproductive health and rights on the development agenda. Now, eleven years later, despite attempts to put the Cairo promises into action, the cracks in the Cairo consensus are appearing with deliberate attempts to squash an open democratic debate on the deeper implications of the sexual and reproductive health and rights agenda.

Development 48.4 sets out to signal where work needs to be done to shore up the cracks, to maintain gains and where to be on our guard. A particular focus is on the rights based agenda and the links between sexual and reproductive health and rights of women and macro-economic policies.

The strong message of the journal is that stakes are even higher now for women and health activists to fight against the strong neo-liberal and neo-conservative agendas. There is an urgent need to keep sexual health and rights at the core of progressive, socially just human development.

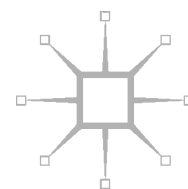

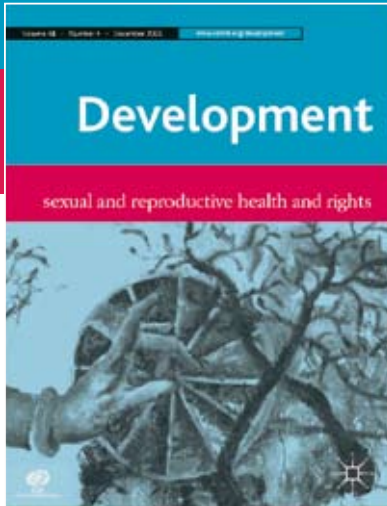
